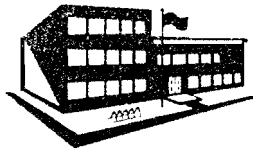

Lakewood High School
2007 - 2008 Parking Permit Agreement

- 1. All vehicles must be registered with the school and the student-parking permit must be displayed in a clearly visible location from the outside of the vehicle.
2. All vehicles must have the state required insurance.
3. All drivers must have a valid driver's license.
4. ALL DRIVERS MUST PROVIDE PROOF OF INSURANCE, DRIVER'S LICENSE, AND VEHICLE REGISTRATION AT TIME OF PURCHASE.
5. Speed limit on school property is 10 MPH and the vehicle must be operated in a safe and legal manner at all times.
6. Students are not allowed to loiter (hang around) in the parking lots or vehicles before, during, or after school hours.
7. Lakewood High School and Jefferson County School District are not responsible for any loss or damage to vehicles or contents.
8. Use of tobacco products is not allowed on school property even if you are in your vehicle.
9. Report any accidents to Campus Supervisors immediately.
10. Altering or falsifying a hangtag could result in suspension and/or loss of parking privileges.
11. Transferring your hangtag to another student without permission from administration could result in revocation of parking privileges without refund.
12. Carpooling is allowed. All vehicles in the carpool must be registered with campus supervisors.
13. You may be ticketed or booted at your expense for violating any of LHS' parking policies.
14. You have 10 days to dispute any fines. If not resolved within this time, the fine(s) will remain on the fine list and will not be reduced or excused. If you receive a ticket that you feel is in error, you must bring a copy of the ticket to the Campus Supervisor and explain the error before the 10-day time limit expires.
15. Acceptance of this permit constitutes acknowledgement by holder(s) that he/she has read and agrees to the above conditions.

The Counseling Connection

Schedule Pick-up:

New and returning LHS students will be picking up their schedule of classes sometime on August 8th, 9th, or 10th depending on their grade level (see schedule printed elsewhere in this bulletin).

Schedule Errors:

If, after reviewing their schedule, students discover an error or mistake in their course selection, counselors will be available on these days to make adjustments. Mistakes would include things like double-booked blocks, not enough classes, or incorrect class level. *Schedule changes for any other reason will not be made until schedule change days on August 27th and August 29th.* (See below for additional information.)

Schedule Changes:

We feel it is important for students to attend the courses they originally selected at least once before initiating a schedule change request. Consequently, schedule changes will be done after the first two days of the semester on Monday, August 27th and Wednesday, August 29th! Students can come in to request a change either before or after school or during one of their off blocks on these two days only. Remember, it is the policy of Lakewood High School to make schedule *changes for educational reasons* (for example: failure to complete a prerequisite requirement) but *not to accommodate jobs, teacher preferences, or transportation problems*. Students should keep in mind that they can only see their counselor once to make schedule changes.

LHS PARKING INFORMATION

Students who wish to park their cars on the Lakewood High School campus must pay the \$62.50 per semester parking fee. (Students are encouraged to pay for parking for the entire school year.) *This fee has been assessed by the Board of Education and is charged at all Jefferson County high schools.*

To register your car, you will need to complete the parking registration form that will be available at schedule pick up and the following is also required:

1. \$125.00 (full year's parking)
2. A valid driver's license, proof of insurance, vehicle registration and parking payment receipt.

(A student may register up to three (3) cars owned by his/her family.)

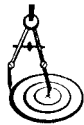
